- Central banks (*Riksbanken*, in other countries, European Central Bank)
- Government departments (Finansdepartementet, Utrikesdepartementet, Socialdepartementet, Näringsdepartementet)
- Institutes for analysis and research
- Public authorities (Konjunkturinstitutet, Kommerskollegium, AMS, Socialstyrelsen, Riksförsäkringsverket, Konkurrensverket, others)
- Regional and local councils, the health system
- Aid agencies (Sida, others)
- IMF, World Bank, OECD, FN, WTO, EU, WHO, ILO
- Non-governmental organizations
- Large companies, consultancy firms, employers organizations, trade unions organizations, pharmaceutical firms
